Chief Fire Warden

Course Overview This course is designed to provide participants with the appropriate knowledge and skills to perform the duties of a fire warden in their workplace. The course material is intended to enable staff to meet requirements under the Fire Safety Regulations.

Prerequisite

Attendees must have completed Warden training. This can be conducted as part of this course.

Course Outline

- Course introduction and enrolment
- Identify, monitor and report situations that could lead to workplace emergencies
- Identify, report and correct situations that could prevent workplace emergencies being handled safely
- Preparing for emergencies
- Roles and responsibilities of EPC and ECO
- Reporting emergencies and potential emergencies
- Responding to emergencies warning devices
- Initiate Incident Control
- Manage evacuation procedures and post evacuation procedures
- Managing human behaviour during emergency situations
- Minimise the impact of the emergency
- Manage and develop emergency procedures and procedure assessment activities
- Emergency prevention, mitigation and preparedness
- Assessment of students' competence

Course Logistics

Where: This course is designed to be delivered at your workplace.

Duration: To maximize learning benefits, it is recommended that this course be conducted with a maximum of 8 participants over a period of 5 1/2 hours.

Resources: Suitable classroom equipped with whiteboard. Access to the worksite for identifying fire safety equipment, signage, escape paths and assembly points. A practical evacuation of an area or part of an area is recommended.
